WHAT is happening?

Veolia the operator of Seafield wastewater treatment works will be undertaking essential maintenance of a sludge centrifuge on the 23rd and 24th of May, for which an Odour Risk Assessment has been produced. This will temporarily reduce the volume of sludge processed for the duration of the activity. In preparation for this activity and to avoid a build-up of sludge in the process, sludge levels have been reduced as a mitigation in accordance with the Odour Risk Assessment and in order to guard against odour release.

WHY are we telling you?

Based on the weather forecast as summarised below, conditions may contribute to an increased risk of odour but we are committed to ensuring any such risk is minimised. As part of our ongoing commitment to minimise any inconvenience associated with the operation of the treatment works, we recognise the need to maintain open communication with our neighbours. As this work is a non-standard odour sensitive activity, we want to keep you informed in advance.

WHEN is this happening?

Work will commence on the 23rd of May and will continue on the 24th.
