Some notable work and recent results in the Leith Links area

- Retail crime continues to be a focus. Many offenders are also linked to other issues such as drugs and anti-social behaviour which has wider impact on the community. On 04/09/25 we carried out a day of action involving uniformed and plain clothes officers. This resulted in 3 arrests of prominent individuals. Further dates are planned for October.
- Over the September weekends we have carried out inspections at Licences premises alongside our colleagues from the Council. During the visits, three arrests were made in relation to threatening behaviour and refusing to leave a licences premises.
- Community Officers held a bike marking events at The Shore. Over 30 bikes were marked using Bike Register, helping
 to prevent and detect bike theft in and around Leith.
- Community Officers uplifted a vehicle which was causing an obstruction on Leith Walk after reports from the public.
- Community officers attended at Hermitage Park Primary School and gave talks to the children in relation to antibullying. Further dates are planned for other local Schools in the area.
- Planning is now well underway for this year's Op Crackle the Police response to Halloween/bonfire night.
 Community Officers play a key part in the lead up as well as on the nights. Visits to schools, licences premises and focussing on problem individuals aim to educate, disrupt and deter.

Friday Night Lights

- Each week, Leith Community Policing officers work with Sports Scotland at "Friday Night Lights" youth initiative, to support reducing anti-social behaviour in the Leith area through a programme of activities and sports aimed at young people aged 9-12 years that were deemed 'at risk' of committing crime and/or antisocial behaviour.
- The initiative runs on Friday evenings, between 6pm and 10pm, which is a time traditionally associated with such antisocial behaviour.
- This initiative is run in conjunction with various community groups across Leith including YMCA Edinburgh, Leith Academy, Hibernian Community Foundation, Pilmeny Development Project and Lochend Football Academy.
- Participants have reacted positively to the initiative, and there has been a marked decrease in youth-related antisocial behaviour since the project's inception.



Edinburgh-wide Police Reports and Information

- On a quarterly basis, the Edinburgh Divisional Commander attends and provides both a written and verbal report to the <u>Edinburgh Council Culture and Communities Committee</u>, during which scrutiny is provided in terms of the division's performance against the Local Policing Plan and other ongoing or emerging issues. - Our Local Police Plan 2023-26 outlines our local Divisional priorities and is accessible via the Police Scotland website. Members of Edinburgh Division's Senior Management Team routinely respond to queries received from Elected Representatives, including MPs', MSPs' and constituents' concerns across a broad spectrum of topics.
- From a locality perspective, each of the 4 Local Area Commanders chair local Community Improvement Partnerships and form part of the Locality Community Planning Partnerships, in order to address local concerns in partnership.
